***Subject:***

**RESOLVE #18-13/14 - That \$4,172,291 be raised and appropriated for the annual payments on debt service previously approved by the voters for non-State-funded school construction projects and non-State-funded portions of school construction projects in addition to the funds appropriated as the local share of the City's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from pre-kindergarten to grade 12. Passage requires majority vote.**

Explanation: Non-State-funded debt service is the amount of money needed for the annual payments on the City's long-term debt for major school construction projects that are not approved for state subsidy. The bonding of this long-term debt was previously approved by the voters of the City as follows:

- *SPHS Auditorium/Cafeteria Construction, approved by voters on November 8, 1994.*
- *Elementary Schools Construction and Renovation, approved by voters on November 6, 2001.*
- *South Portland High School Addition and Renovation, approved by voters on November 2, 2010.*

This resolve is brought forward as part of approving the Fiscal Year 2015 Budget for the South Portland School Department.
